November 2019 - The CREATE partners had the honor of providing Congressman Jesús "Chuy" Garcia (IL-4), member of the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, a tour of CREATE projects on November 7, 2019. Congressman Garcia visited the Chicago Transportation Coordination Office (CTCO), Harlem Avenue Grade Separation (GS18, not started), Indiana Harbor Belt Railroad at 71st Street Grade Separation (GS14, completed in 2013), 75th Street Corridor Improvement Project (P3 and GS19, in final design) and Englewood Flyover (P1, completed in 2016). In addition to highlighting CREATE's national importance, the partners relayed the local mobility, transit, education and workforce benefits associated with CREATE projects such as the Harlem Avenue Grade Separation and 75th Street Corridor Improvement Project.
